After-School Tutoring

Several of the families placed in the Emergency Shelter in Franklin have school-aged children enrolled in Franklin schools. The Franklin Interfaith Council is organizing after-school tutoring one day per week (to start) and will expand as capacity allows. We are waiting to hear which day will be best for the shelter's schedule.

All volunteers will be CORI checked and will have to complete abuse-prevention training, or show proof that they have already done so.
